First Aid Box/Accident Book located: In the clubhouse

Beverley & East Riding Croquet Club aims to prevent accidents to its members, visitors and employees, as well as provide adequate control of health and safety risks from sport, work and leisure activities. We will achieve this aim by undertaking relevant risk assessments, and by ensuring action required to remove and control risks is carried out. This policy will be regularly monitored and reviewed. We will inform all club members and employees of the club of the Health & Safety policy and relevant risk assessments. A copy of this policy (and risk assessments) will be displayed in the clubhouse for all visitors to consult. Any individuals identified in this policy document have specific responsibilities; however all club members and employees should take reasonable care of their own health and safety and report any concerns in this area to the relevant individual (as named in this policy) or to a member of the committee.

This policy is designed to cover the clubhouse, the storage shed, the three lawns and connecting outside space at Rowley Manor. The hotel operates its own policies with regard to use of its facilities. Furthermore, Beverley & East Riding Croquet Club has public liability and employer's liability insurance as part of its accreditation to the Croquet Association, which is renewed annually.

The indoor season (November-March) is played at Bishop Burton village hall which has its own Health and Safety policies with regard to use of its facilities. A separate risk assessment has been prepared for indoor play by Beverley & East Riding Croquet Club.
